1 **SECTION 1. ELIGIBILITY FOR EMERGENCY AND MOD-**
2 **ERNIZATION GRANTS.**

3 Section 8007(b)(3) of the Elementary and Secondary
4 Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 7707(b)(3)) is amend-
5 ed—

6 (1) in subparagraph (C)(i)(I), by adding at the
7 end the following:

8 “(cc) At least 10 percent of
9 the property in the agency is
10 nontaxable due to the presence of
11 the Federal Government.”; and

12 (2) by adding at the end the following:

13 “(F) LIMITATIONS ON ELIGIBILITY RE-
14 QUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall not limit
15 eligibility—

16 “(i) under subparagraph (C)(i)(I)(aa),
17 to those local educational agencies in which
18 the number of children determined under
19 section 8003(a)(1)(C) for each such agency
20 for the preceding school year constituted
21 more than 40 percent of the total student
